#### WHAT IS GIFTED AND TALENTED?

The Texas Education Agency defines a gifted/talented student as a child who performs at or shows the potential for performing at a remarkably high level of accomplishment when compared to others of the same age, experience, or environment and who

- exhibits high performance capability in an intellectual, creative, or artistic area;
- possesses an unusual capacity for leadership; or
- excels in a specific academic field. (Texas Education Code 29.121)

#### WHY GIFTED AND TALENTED?

According to the National Association for Gifted Children, students with gifts and talents:

- Come from all racial, ethnic, and cultural populations, as well as all economic strata.
- Require sufficient access to appropriate learning opportunities to realize their potential.
- Can have learning and processing disorders that require specialized intervention and accommodation.
- Need support and guidance to develop socially and emotionally as well as in their areas of talent.
- Require varied services based on their changing needs.

#### OVERVIEW OF G/T SERVICES

- The focus of an advanced level program is to:
- Routinely determine student needs, interests, and abilities.
- Differentiate instruction with respect to content, process, product, and learning environment.
- Offer cross-curricular opportunities through integrated academic and real-world connections with problem solving experiences.

#### OVERVIEW OF G/T SERVICES

- Offer opportunities for collaborative research and independent study.
- Operate intentionally within the application, analysis, evaluation, and synthesis levels of Bloom's Taxonomy.
- Utilize technology as a resource, productivity, and communication tool.

#### IDENTIFICATION AND ASSESSMENT PROCEDURES

- Students may be referred for the gifted and talented program by teachers, counselors, administrators, parents, or other interested persons.
- The referral window is from November 1 through November 15 of each school year.
- Referral forms are available in the front office at Paint Creek ISD.
- Students referred will be screened to determine their eligibility for GT services. The
  screening consists of a collection of quantitative data (a continuum of 3 assessments) and
  qualitative data.

# GT ASSESSMENT CONTINUUM QUANTITATIVE MEASURES

- CogAT (Nonverbal Assessment) measures a student's reasoning abilities through the use of visuals/pictures. CoGAT is given online and proctored by the district's GT Coordinator.
- Iowa Test of Basic Skills (or Logramos for Spanish-speakers) a standardized achievement test that measures what a student has learned. This test is also online and proctored by the district's GT Coordinator.
- Torrance Test of Creativity a creativity assessment given in a face-to-face setting

# QUALITATIVE MEASURES

This part of the screening looks for input from those who know the student:

- Parent Inventory and Consent to Test
- Teacher Inventory
- Student Product

#### COMMITTEE DECISION

- The district's GT Committee will meet after all screening is complete.
- Letters will be sent home notifying parents of the results of the identification process.
- Students identified (Ist-I2th grades) will start receiving gifted services beginning in August of the following school year. Kindergarten students identified will start services in March of the current school year.
